

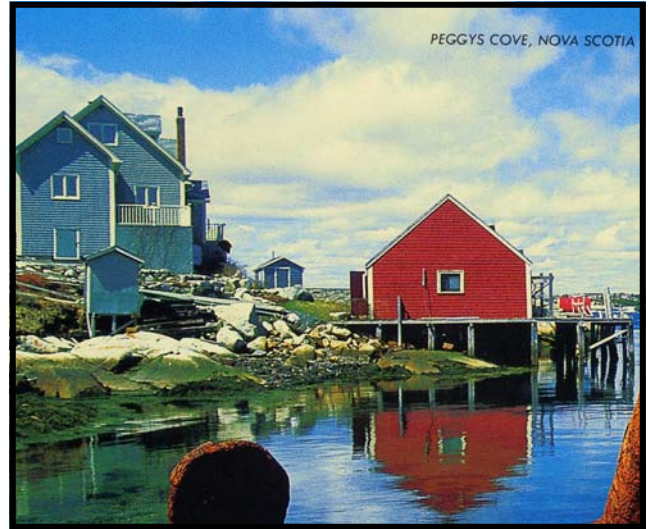

Nova Scotia Itinerary

Day 1 - Sunday, July 24 ~ Arrive at the Best Western Merry Manor Inn, Portland, ME where you will stay for one night. Dinner tonight is included.

Day 2 - Monday, July 25 ~ Enjoy a full breakfast before departing for the Canadian Maritimes. Meet your guide and discover New Brunswick's largest city, St. John. Canada's first incorporated city is located on scenic Bay of Fundy, home of the highest tides in the world. This overview tour includes rich historic sites, Victorian-influenced architecture, brick walkways, historic churches, town squares and flowers blooming around old fashioned lamp posts. Then continue on to your next hotel, the Fort Howe Hotel for one night. Then see the Reversing Falls, a – natural phenomenon where the massive tides of the Bay of Fundy force the St. John River to churn, tumble and turn upstream through a rocky gorge.

Day - Tuesday, July 26 ~ After a full breakfast, your step-on guide takes you through Fundy National Park in the spectacular Acadian Highlands Region with rugged shoreline, inland forests and unique eco-systems. Then it's on to the Hopewell Rocks, "The Ocean Tidal Exploration Site", recognized as one of Canada's best natural sites. Here, the power of the Bay of Fundy tides can be witnessed (the most drastic in the world). See curious rock formations sculpted by the tides known as the world's largest "Flower Pots". Visit the Ocean Tidal Exploration Centre offering a great view of the Bay of Fundy, one of the Marine Wonders of the World. Then check out Magnetic Hill, a natural phenomenon where it is said that cars and other rolling objects actually go uphill. Dinner tonight is included. Arrive at the Country Inn and Suites, New Glasgow, NS, your hotel for the next two nights.

Day 4 - Wednesday July 27 ~ Enjoy a deluxe Continental breakfast before beginning a full day of guide service on PEI. Take the Northumberland Ferry Service across the scenic Northumberland Strait between Caribou, NS and Woods Island, PEI - a 75 minute excursion. Then tour Charlottetown, the "Birthplace of Canada". Highlights include the Victoria Park, Great George Street, Fanningbank, St. Dunstan's Basilica, Province House historic site, Charlottetown Waterfront and Confederation Landing. There will be time for lunch on your own. After, visit Prince Edward Island National Park, located along the scenic Gulf of St. Lawrence on the northern side of PEI. This park offers natural spectacular systems of sand dunes, pristine beaches, sandstone cliffs, salt marshes and fresh water ponds. Hear the history of the former occupants including the Mi'kmaq, Acadian Fisherman and British Farmers. Then visit the Green Gables Home. Tour the charming farm house that inspired L.M. Montgomery to create her beloved tale, Anne of Green Gables. Learn about the heritage of the area, the significance of the site and literary works and L.M. Montgomery's role as an author. See the Haunted Woods and Balsam Hollow trail as described in the book. Dinner on PEI is included tonight.

Day 5 - Thursday July 28 ~ After another deluxe Continental breakfast, enjoy another full day of guide service, this time on Cabot Trail. Meet your guide and discover the wonder of the famous Cabot Trail, known world-wide for its spectacular scenery. Travel along rugged seacoast, through quaint fishing villages, rich forestlands and atop lofty mountains. Travel through Cape Breton Highlands National Park with your cameras ready for the wildlife and many photo-ops. See the parallels between this incredibly scenic geography and Scotland's terrain, its name sake. Then arrive at the Silver Dart Lodge, Baddeck, NS, overlooking Bras d'Or Lakes, where you will stay for one night. Savor a taste of Nova Scotia with a buffet featuring the wonderful cuisine of this Canadian Maritime region at the Lodge (at your leisure), offering Nova Scotia favorites. This evening, enjoy some musical entertainment with live music at the lodge featuring Celtic and Traditional tunes.

Day 6 - Friday July 29 ~ After a full breakfast, travel to the Halifax Waterfront. You will have time for lunch (on your own) in this bustling waterfront district, filled with shops, eateries and views. Then tour Halifax with your guide and discover the "Hub" of Nova Scotia. See the lovely Victorian Public Gardens, hear the amazing story of the Halifax explosion and learn the city's role in the recovery operations of the Titanic. View the historic downtown, the waterfront, Citadel Hill, St. Paul's Church, universities and more. Then arrive at the Country Inn and Suites, Dartmouth, NS, where you will be staying for two nights. Dinner tonight is included.

Day 7 - Saturday July 30 ~ Enjoy a deluxe Continental breakfast before traveling to the Maritime Museum of the Atlantic. a fascinating museum featuring exhibits on Nova Scotia's rich maritime and nautical history, the city's devastating Halifax Explosion and the close ties Nova Scotia shares with the unsinkable Titanic. The see Peggy's Cove, the most picturesque fishing village on the eastern seaboard featuring a quaint lighthouse atop the wave washed rocks. Take time to explore this working fishing village, browse the gift and craft shops and have lunch on own. Next, tour through the Halifax Citadel Historic Site, a 19th century fort perched high on a hill overlooking Halifax Harbor. This massive star-shaped fortification took 28 years to complete. See the kilted 78th Regiment Highlander standing guard and the pageantry of a bygone era. Dinner tonight is at the Halifax Feast Dinner Theater with nine choices of entrée followed by the featured Musical Comedy.

Day 8 - Sunday July 31 ~ After a deluxe Continental breakfast, visit the Grand Pre National Historic Site, dedicated to the expulsion of the Acadians, the event that inspired Longfellow to write the 1755 romantic epic, "Evangeline". Travel the scenic Evangeline Trail, tour through the 17th Century church and walk the sweeping gardens. Travel the French Shore through the scenic Annapolis Valley, passing some of North America's earliest European settlements, taking you past quaint villages, orchards, fortresses, farms and fishing villages. Then meet your costumed guide for an Annapolis Royal Tour and discover Canada's first established community. Stop at historic Fort Anne and the Port-Royal Habitation, recounting Champlain's 1605 fur-trading post. Hear about the Acadia story in its birthplace and the Scottish influences. See the Melanson Settlement, Nova Scotia's oldest home, and more. Then board the Princess of Acadia Bay Ferry and cruise from Digby, NS to St. John, NB, three hour ferry ride. Dinner will be served onboard (included). Then travel to the Fort Howe Hotel, St. John, New Brunswick for one night.

Day 9 - Monday August 1 ~ After a full breakfast, visit Roosevelt Campobello International Park to learn about the Roosevelt family at the visitor's center. Walk through the beautiful gardens, enjoy ocean vistas and tour through the Roosevelt family summer home and cottages. A boxed lunch is included and comes with incredible views. Next, visit West Quoddy Light, where the sun first hits the United States, and Visitor's Center. Travel Maine's scenic coast for Lobster on the water overlooking beautiful Penobscot Bay. Stay at the Best Western Merry Manor Inn, Portland, ME tonight.

Day 10 - Tuesday August 2 ~ Depart for home after a full breakfast.
